The ability to teach LAMDA (London Academy of Music & Dramatic Art) is highly desirable, adding value to our established programme. The Drama Department is based in our recently redeveloped and refurbished theatre, which underwent a major transformation over the summer of 2023.

The successful candidate will be an integral member of the Drama Department, teaching across different year groups and contributing significantly to practical drama and the wider school community. You will be expected to help direct various productions and run drama activities that are a central part of the College's co-curricular life. These activities will align with your interests and expertise, allowing you to help shape the drama experience at Llandovery College.

This role presents an exciting opportunity for an experienced teacher to help shape and guide the future direction of Drama at Llandovery College, promoting its continued growth and long-term success. You will play a pivotal role in enhancing the status of Drama within the College, ensuring that it continues to thrive and flourish as part of our vibrant school community.

- To integrate ICT, literacy, numeracy, and your subject specialism(s) into the teaching and learning experience for pupils.
- To ensure a high-quality learning experience for pupils that meets both internal and external quality standards.
- To prepare pupils for qualifications and external examinations, ensuring they are well-equipped for success.
- To use a variety of teaching methods that will engage and stimulate learning, tailored to pupils' needs and the demands of the curriculum.
- To support the work of teaching assistants, trainee teachers, and newly qualified teachers.
- To maintain discipline in accordance with the College's procedures, fostering a culture of good practice regarding punctuality, behaviour, work standards, and independent study.
